Expected completion date - July 2010.

On October 5th, Scott Day will present the urban feasibility study for the business district to a combined meeting of the City Council, the Economic Development Corporation, and the Planning & Zoning Commission. The presentation begins at 6:30 pm.

Important Information

The City recently awarded a contract for Street Maintenance to Frontier Paving. This project will patch and repair portions of failed asphalt. It will also repair several storm water inlets and will crack seal many of our streets. This is part of a preventative maintenance program that will help to extend the life of our new infrastructure.

Work on this project is expected to begin on or about September 21, 2009 and will take approximately 45 days. The contractor is expected to begin work on the asphalt repairs first and then work into the crack seal portion of the project. Work will generally progress from south to north through town. In the instance that any driveways would need to be blocked, you will be notified by the contractor in advance.

Fall Haul Off—October 10

The semi-annual Haul Off will be Saturday, October 10th, beginning at 7 am. Please leave your items at curbside by 7 am, or the night before. Remember we cannot accept any of the following items:

- paint unless cans are completely dried out
- no pesticides
- batteries
- tires
- large appliances
- anything containing Freon
- no items weighing more than 40 pounds
- no building materials (including lumber, sheetrock, or concrete)

In case of very heavy rain the alternate pick-up date will be Saturday, October 17th. Light rain will not delay the Haul-Off! If you have questions, please call City Hall or ask any of Public Works employees.

STORM WATER INFORMATION

REDUCE STORM WATER POLLUTION

Auto Care

Polluted runoff is the nation's greatest threat to clean water. By practicing healthy household habits, homeowners can keep common pollutants like automotive fluids off the ground and out of storm water. Adopt these habits and remember to share with your neighbors. Please remember dumping automotive fluids into storm drains has the same result as dumping the materials directly into a water body.

- Use a commercial carwash that treats or recycles its wastewater.
- Wash your car on your yard so the water infiltrates into the ground.
- Check your car, boat, motorcycle, and other machinery and equipment for leaks and spills.
- Make repairs as soon as possible and clean up spilled fluids with an absorbent material like kitty litter or sand and do not rinse the spills into a nearby storm drain.
- Remember to properly dispose of the absorbent material.
- Repair leaks and dispose of used auto fluids and batteries at designated drop-off or recycling locations.
